After a while we reached the end of the trip and we met up with some train cars that were going to take us up a 45 degree incline to the exit of the cave. All the way up the steep incline the train is rocking back and forth and you feel like you're about to fall all the way back down to the foot of the cave. Fortunately that never happened, and we made it up safely. After that we were led from the back entrance to the main park again so we could continue with our wondrous trip.
